

Acceptable Use Policy

We're in this thing together. The actions individual members take can have a big impact on our system as a whole. That's why all Carerix API users must follow this Acceptable Use Policy in their use of Carerix API.

If you violate this policy, we may suspend or terminate your account. We may also suspend or terminate accounts according to our "Terms of Use" in respect to the Carerix API, where we see behavior, content, or other factors that poses a threat to our system.

Prohibited Content

Please don't use Carerix API to upload anything offensive in the Carerix application. It is also not allowed to upload content without permission from the original author or organisation.

Prohibited Actions

We work hard to maintain the positive reputation of our system, but we count on our customers to pitch in too. You may not:

- Use the information from the Carerix application via the Carerix API to create or send Spam.
- Upload or retrieve via the Carerix API any material that wasn't created by you, provided for you to use, or that would violate anyone's rights. That includes text, photos, graphics, and other content.
- Share your password.
- Decipher, decompile, disassemble, or reverse engineer any of the software on our website and/or the Carerix API.
- To create a competing product using the Carerix API.
- (Re)Send or forward personal mail retrieved from the Carerix application via the Carerix API.
- Upload large quantities of content (photos, documents large attachments) and by doing this violate the fair-use policy as explained in the Carerix Application Terms.
- Create heavy traffic load on our Carerix API servers because of bad programming and/or large transaction volumes. This may result in automatic deactivation of the Carerix API Service.
